Dear delegates,

My name is Filip Janković and I am a green activist in ZOS, running to become a member of the Executive committee of the Cooperation and Development Network Eastern Europe (CDN), because for over a year now I have been involved with the CDN's member organisation as a member of the Main Board of the Green Youth of Serbia, where I had the chance to participate in various national and international political and strategic and decision making processes. During my mandate in the Main Board of ZOS, I have been the contact person for CDN, in regular touch with EC responsible, which makes me familiar with the work and/or news and updates around CDN. Most recently, I have worked directly with CDN and FYEG on organising the first European Train Tour stop in Belgrade, an event that gathered over seventy young people all over Europe to discuss various important topics to our movement, such as fighting social and economic inequality or fostering international solidarity and peace. Apart from my green political engagement in ZOS, I have been engaged in youth activism for over six years now, in various local, national and international organisations.

As a primary example to this, I have the honour of representing my organisation in broader youth coalition talk for a joint campaign of fight against Vučić's regime, which at one point included coordinating ZOS's support for student-led demonstration efforts in Belgrade.

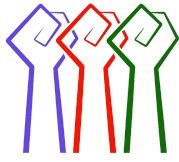
